





The American Dream?




Parental "Enrichment" Spending on Children





Say Yes's Track Record

Within the first three years of Say Yes Buffalo:



 Universal school-based mental health clinics, and mobile health clinics



• 5 school-based legal clinics have opened



 100% of school buildings are staffed with Family Support Specialists (across 55 buildings)



 Summer camp was offered at 35 sites through partnerships with 33 community based service providers in 2015, with a long-term sustainable funding plan through 2021

 Over 170,000 public school students have access to Say Yes support services and postsecondary scholarships




 Postsecondary matriculation has increased by 10 percentage points (from 57% in 2012 to 67% in 2018)



 In 2014, for every \$1.00 Say Yes spent in Buffalo, it leveraged \$15.11 in external investments toward student supports

 Buffalo has seen a 42% reduction in their Foster Care placement since the implementation of Say Yes-savings of \$11.5M per year



WHAT DOES THIS MEAN FOR Eastern Washington

- Today, the combined net worth in Eastern Washington stands at \$200 billion.
- Over the next ten years, an estimated \$29 billion of that wealth will transfer between generations.
- Endowed community funds totaling \$1.4
 billion could be established if just 5% of this wealth transfer was directed to community giving.
- After just five years, local community funds could support over \$60 million in annual grantmaking for the benefit of Eastern Washington
